SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT!

This pandemic isn't the first trial Christ's Church has faced. It won't be the last. Over the centuries, believers have endured persecution, torture, illness, starvation, and rejection. Yet through each crisis, they clung to Christ and each other.

Even today, the church not only survives, but thrives, in places where meeting together is forbidden. Believers find a way to be together because they know they must. Of course, "being together" can look different, depending on circumstances. For example, Paul couldn't physically be with the churches he planted after he was imprisoned (a form of quarantine!) yet he remained "present" by penning letters to the churches and people he knew and loved. These letters became the books in the Bible we know as Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians and Philemon. Though unable to be present in person, Paul found a way to stay spiritually and socially connected on purpose.

Why did Paul put forth the effort to continue "meeting" together when no one would have blamed him if he'd holed up in isolation? Why do believers who face persecution today do the same? Why do Christians walk hours to attend a church service in some parts of the world, when it would be easier to simply stay home?

Because people need each other. Frankly, we need each other more than most of us realize. In my Bible, under the heading, "A Call to Persevere in Faith" I find these words:

Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another - and all the more as you see the Day approaching. — Hebrews 10:23-25
